## **Study on landscape of Art. 6 pilots**

- Regularly updated overview of ongoing Article 6 pilots by bi- and multilateral organizations
- Analysis of emerging rules, trends and experience with Article 6 implementation focusing on how pilot activities respond to the Paris Agreement/NDCs
- The analyzed activities represent the diversity of approaches that can be pursued under Article 6.2/6.4/6.8

#### The global Art. 6 piloting landscape



#### Key changes for Art. 6 pilots compared to Kyoto Mechanisms

- CDM was mainly driven by private sector
  - Companies generated CDM credits as new type of export commodity
  - No risk for government due to export of CDM credits: hands-off
- Art. 6 has larger role for governments
  - Corresponding adjustments for ITMOs, link to NDC accounting and the Enhanced Transparency Framework (Art. 77d): Countries need to "subtract" exported ITMOs from their NDC and report in detail
  - Negotiation of contracts, sharing mitigation with buyer
  - Host country capacity and interaction between actors are crucial!
- Baselines and additionality under Art. 6.4 with greater sector orientation, recognizing BAT or performance benchmarks
  - Lesser role for distinct projects



## The KLiK criteria with relevance for private sector

#### Plausibility of business model

- solid prospect of selling the underlying products
- open to a variety of distribution and/or implementation partners
- potential for replicability / scalability
- activity has already been successfully tested in the field
- financial close is in reach
- Suitability of counterparty
  - track record, reputation of mitigation activity proponent, implementation partner(s)
  - capability of proponent to implement, and operate, the activity
- Convincing role of carbon
- Self sustainability
- Limited and predictable risks of activity





### **Reflections and conclusions with private sector focus**

- Despite delays in negotiations, Article 6 piloting begins to generate practical experience, driven by a small number of host and buyer countries, MDBs
  - Swiss KliK wants contracts with private sector players
  - Criteria highly appropriate for private business
- Many links to existing mechanisms and portfolios
  - Many programmatic approaches, key for successful upscaling
  - Some innovative upscaling (TCAF, SCF) but slow to materialize
- Uncertain CDM transition may constrain early Art.6 action
- East African private sector experience and concerns should inform finalization of PA rulebook, and continuous evolution of Article 6 rules
